Constitution for the Arrow Equestrian Club

1 Title

The Club will be known as "The Arrow Equestrian Club"

2 Objects

The objects of the club are

- A To promote excellence in riding and horsemanship
- B To promote complementary therapies and techniques together with Classical Riding.
- C To provide horses and teaching of a high quality
- D To provide training and education on all aspects of horsemanship
- E To encourage participants to achieve their full potential
- F To oppose any training method which abuses the horses nature

3 Membership

Membership fees will be set annually at the AGM and will be due on January 1st. Membership may be refused or withdrawn on the grounds that such membership would be prejudicial to the objects of the club as set out in 2 above. Discounts on "Lessons" are with sue Nevill-Parker only. There will be 3 categories of membership:

A Silver Membership £25 per annum

Benefits :

- Access to all facilities including Arrow horses
- Regular Newsletters
- £10 discount on all lessons on the Equine simulator
- "Members Rates" for clinics, lectures and courses

B Gold Membership £70 per annum (May be paid in 2 equal instalments, one cheque dated in January and a second cheque dated July)

Benefits:

- All of the above plus
- £10 discount on all riding lessons

C Joint (family) Gold Membership £100 per annum

(May be paid in 2 equal instalments as above)

Benefits:

- All of the above but a shared newsletter

4 Property and Funds

The club is non profit making but will charge fees and pay for goods, services and facilities offered by the club and any of its members. Club members have access to the following facilities and horses at Weston House Farm without in any way claiming ownership of such.

- A "School" Horses stabled at Weston House Farm .
- B The library and its resources
- C The therapy room and spa
- D On site accommodation
- E On site stabling and the indoor school

5 Administration

Sue Nevill-Parker will be responsible for the on site management of the club and its activities. The committee will assist with the promotion and organisation of clinics, lectures, demonstrations and events and other related activities that may be suggested by the membership.

6 The committee

- (i) The committee will be made up of a Chairperson (Sue Nevill-Parker) plus 6 people, 3 to be elected by the membership and 3 to be nominated by the committee.
- (ii) Members of the committee shall hold office for 2 years from the date of the AGM at which they were elected
- (iii) Postal votes and proxy votes will be allowed at the AGM
- (iv) Additional committee members may be co-opted onto the committee for short periods for specialist advice. They will not have the right to vote at committee meetings.

7 Meetings

- (i) The Annual General Meeting will be held within 13 months of the last AGM. The agenda for the AGM will include

- A Minutes of the last meeting
- B Matters arising
- C A report from the chairperson and/or Sue Nevill-Parker
- D A report from the Treasurer
- E Election of committee members
- F Membership rates for the following year
- G Any other matters raised by members

- (ii) Committee meetings will be held from time to time during the year.

- (iii) A quorum for committee meetings shall be 4

- (iv) A Special Meeting may be called by the committee or not less than 20% of the membership. Members must be given no less than 2 months notice of such a meeting and if the situation calls for a vote by the members, proxy votes and postal votes will be allowed.

8 Dissolution

Should the members decide to dissolve the club, any monies left after the payment of all debts, shall be donated to a charity with similar aims.
